Vacancy Student Assistant (E-Tutor)

The Chair of African Legal Studies is seeking a Student Assistant (E-Tutor) to support the development of an interactive, digital human rights learning tool during the winter semester 2025/26. The position is funded from **October 2025 to February 2026** and offers **training and certification as an E-Tutor** and involves close collaboration with the teaching team and participating students.

About the Project

This position supports the teaching activities of the Chair of African Legal Studies, with a particular focus on the seminar “Environmental Law and Climate Justice” and other related courses. At its core, the project explores the practical application of human rights mechanisms at the national, regional, and international levels.

Building on previous semesters, where students created interactive tools such as the “Environmental Law and Climate Justice: Case Study on the East African Crude Oil Pipeline”, this semester introduces a new emphasis on accessible and engaging digital learning formats. The aim is to enhance the blended learning experience – especially for students participating remotely, such as those based in Somalia – by combining audio-based content with interactive and text-based elements.

The branching scenario tool will continue to be part of the learning landscape, which may be complemented by supplemental case-based learning materials across all courses of the Chair of African Legal Studies as well as a podcast series.
